Dear Friends

I thought I might summarise the story of Easter in my note to you all today. It is a reminder of the last few weeks we have spent reflecting our relationship and walk in faith with God.

This holy time started with Shrove Tuesday. Exactly 47 days before Easter, we ate pancakes to mark the time when we may stop or start doing something as we focus on our walk with God. On Ash Wednesday we started Lent. You may have received the sign of the cross on your forehead as a mark of penitence and of trust in God. Lent lasts 40 days, recalling the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, tempted by the devil, before he started his ministry on earth.

Last Sunday, we celebrated Palm Sunday, remembering Jesus' triumphant arrival in Jerusalem. Crowds waived palms and shouted Hosanna as a mark of praise. On Thursday, we remember the last supper and Jesus washing the feet of his disciples, reflecting on what this means to us as Christians.

On Good Friday, we followed the stations of the cross, to remind us of Jesus trial and his selfless journey to the cross to save us all from our sins. You might have spent some time in Church on Friday quietly reflecting what this means during The Watch.

And so, to this Sunday morning, Easter Day. Christ is risen, alleluia, alleluia. On this joyous day we give praise for Jesus' resurrection, as he foretold. We celebrate the new life we have been given, forgiveness for our sins and the promise of everlasting life.

Mark's reading is not all about easter eggs and bunnies, though. It's an abrupt ending to Mark's journal of Jesus life. But why would this be? How does it compare to the other gospels? What might we take from Mark's version? I hope to explore this with you this Sunday morning.

A very happy Easter to you all.
