Dear Friends

In the Salisbury and Avon Gazette this week I read an article about a 'secret' work of art found in a village church – an early 'rood' depicting Christ crucified, with Mary and John at the foot of the cross. The 11th Century rood was moved from the main church in the 14th or 15th century and hidden in a loft room, which the conservators believe was a sort of mediaeval 'virtual reality box' – a tiny space in which one could stand entirely surrounded by paintings of the crucifixion, including an elaborate landscape and countryside setting, and contemplate Christ's suffering as if the worshipper were actually there. The rood is one of the earliest English examples of the depiction of Christ's suffering on the cross.

There is an intimacy about this image, with John the apostle standing there, he saw it all, and John himself would follow a path to martyrdom in exile and hard labour on the island of Patmos. He went into his ministry with his eyes open - he saw it all, and yet gladly laid down his own life, along with the other apostles who bore witness to Jesus. In what ways are we called to bear witness and lay down our lives today?
