Dear Friends

If you could pick three passages to talk about, it would be difficult to think of any better!

First: an educated, enquiring man is travelling back home from Jerusalem to Sudan reading from the prophet Isaiah. He almost certainly looked different, felt different and sounded strange. He would probably have been ignored or ostracised by some. But, through Philip explaining a passage of one of the Jewish prophets and no doubt telling him his own story, he experienced the restorative love of Jesus and "went on his way rejoicing".

Next: Jesus told his disciples, and he also tells us, that he is the true vine and that he cares for the branches connected to him. We are those branches and as we live in union with him as our source, fruitfulness will stream from within us. Quite a promise.

And finally: the Apostle John tells the church: Delightfully loved ones, if Jesus loved us with such tremendous love, then "loving one another" should be our way of life.

Despite my enthusiasm for all three readings, you will be relieved to read that I will only be looking at Philip's encounter with the man we know as the Ethiopian eunuch.

Do read the passages again when you get home. They provide us with such encouragement, but also challenge us to share our own story, the experience of our life with Jesus, with others.


