Dear Friends

Just like the last time I preached to you, I find myself faced with a reading for today (in our epistle) that is very challenging with regard to women's rights, and last time this happened I spoke to you about how we know what a passage is saying to us and how to discern God's voice in scripture.

Sitting with the readings this Thursday morning in September I have the words of this morning's newsreader ringing in my ears. I know that the president of America is currently in this country, meeting with our King. I'm aware that Israel is currently sending ground troops into Gaza. That Russia is escalating drone strikes in Ukraine.

Despite the difficulties that theologians have wrestled with in our scripture passages over the centuries, the voices of our readings from Amos and from Timothy and from the psalm of the day still speak directly for social justice in a way that is recognisably Christlike.

'Hear this, you who trample on the needy and bring the poor of the land to an end, The LORD has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.' Who is like the LORD our God, who is seated on high, who looks far down on the heavens and the earth? He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ashheap, to make them sit with princes, with the princes of his people.'

'First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.' God bless,
