The 1 Timothy reading says: "Godliness with contentment is great gain." Ah, so maybe there IS gain through our lives? Maybe there's more to life than those fattened calves and wine by the bowlful?

It continues: "For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it." So, do we do with what we have got?

We can certainly "Look on the Bright Side of Life" - but there's a brighter side yet to come, I think.
