Dear Friends

An interesting feature of our culture today, I find, is the value that is placed on 'mentoring'. Many schools, universities and businesses recognise the importance of mentoring relationships, which develop personal growth, learning and understanding — often for a particular role in the work-place, or in wider society. The role of the mentor is wider than that of a coach or teacher, often drawing on personal experience and making connections. I have a mentor myself — the vicar who trained me as a curate when I started out in ministry, nearly two decades ago. And I am a mentor myself for clergy who are new to Guildford Diocese - and also to those from within the diocese who are becoming vicars, or Incumbents, for the first time.

Today in our services we'll be focussing on a letter from Paul to his young protégé Timothy (2 Timothy 1:1-14). In many ways Paul, St. Paul, was a mentor to his young apprentice; and it was a relationship that was to last some 20 years or so. We first meet Timothy in the Book of Acts, chapter 16, during what's known as Paul's second missionary journey. On his first journey Paul had founded churches in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey), at Iconium, Lystra and Derbe. On his second journey, while revisiting these churches, Paul first met Timothy. Timothy's grandmother and mother, Lois and Eunice, had been among Paul's first converts from the Jewish community in Lystra; and we learn later that his father was Greek. Paul clearly saw something of deep value in this young man, and immediately invited him to join his team.

From then onwards Paul mentored Timothy as both a disciple of Jesus, but also someone who would work alongside Paul in his missionary calling. Paul's support of this young man would ultimately equip him to fulfil his own calling in Christ. So how did Paul do that? That's what we'll be finding out during our services today!
