Dear Friends

Our Gospel reading for this morning is a familiar one – Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18:9-14). Jesus tells the parable to a group of people who were confident of their own righteousness, and who looked down on everyone else. In today's terms they might be thought of as 'goody goodies'.

Jesus' parable describes two men who go up to the temple in Jerusalem to pray. The first is a Pharisee, a religious leader; and he prays confidently, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income'. There's a real smugness about this man; and maybe Jesus is giving us a caricature to laugh at. He stands apart from everyone else, maybe indicating that he doesn't want to be contaminated by the riff raff around him.

The second character, maybe also a caricature, is a tax collector – or possibly a toll collector. Toll collectors were notorious for extorting money and skimming off a profit for themselves; and this man may have done so. He stands far off, and can't even raise his eyes. He beats his breast and prays, 'God be merciful to me, a sinner'. The two characters couldn't be more different. And Jesus concludes, 'I tell you, this man (the tax collector) went home justified...for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted'.

In our service this morning we'll be considering what it means to 'humble ourselves' before God, and what a life of humility might look like.
