Dear Friends

This morning we celebrate our Patronal Festival: in other words, because we are called 'All Saints' church, we are going to think about what it means to be a saint. Our Gospel reading gives us some ideas — it is Luke's version of the Sermon on the Mount, where we learn that it is not being rich or successful that matters, but loving our enemies, and doing good even to those who treat us badly. Jesus sums it up in what is often called 'the Golden Rule' — 'Do to others as you would have them do to you.'

It's easy to treat our family and friends well — we know they will be grateful, and probably do nice things for us in return. But what about those people who have hurt or insulted us, who we really don't enjoy meeting up with? Jesus tells us we should pray for them, and bless them. These need to be generous prayers — as best we can, should pray that we can see them as God does, as beloved children. Then, perhaps, we can pray God to bless them, and help them be the best versions of themselves. And we can commit ourselves to not try to get back at them, but to keep giving them the second chances that we hope people will give us when we mess up.

Jesus says, 'Blessed are the poor' and 'Woe to you who are rich.' Typing this on the computer I bought less than a year ago, in my comfortable house, I know Jesus is calling me to think and pray carefully about how I use the resources I have been given. That doesn't mean I can't enjoy the good things around me, including the croissants and other treats in church this morning, but I need to work to make sure others can enjoy God's blessings too, especially those most in need.

Today we will explore what it is to be a saint: someone who messes up, as we all do, but keeps learning, and carrying on in Jesus' footsteps. As the song says, 'One more step along the world I go.'.
