Dear Friends

My brother talks a lot - for a man who can talk at length anyway, it really is a LOT - about the Caren tribe he spent time living with. He was utterly blown away by them.

He's visited a lot of tribes in his time, but this one he loved being with so much was the one that was truly pre-agricultural. Things like - they don't have a concept of time in the way that we do. Not even a lunar or solar calendar. They just watch the natural world, see the march of the seasons in the flowers that bloom and mating calls of birds, and know where they are through that. But more than anything else, they don't allow one-up-man-ship, - you know, hierarchy and power-play - they don't allow it in any kind within their community. No-one is allowed to place themselves above others, to say they are better because of this particular skill they have, or that amazing thing they did. And it's the duty of the rest of the tribe to stop such bluster in its tracks.

It's like a different universe to the way we live in the twenty-first century West. Just looking at the egos on show in your average news bulletin, with the constant preening and self-aggrandisement that seems to be popular in the World Leaders Common-room these days, and it's hard to imagine what that other way of living would be like.

But buried in today's readings, particularly Luke, I think we see something of it. There is an odd scrambling for position in the text, as Jewish leaders, soldiers and even fellow prisoners look down on Jesus, jostling for position over him, a chance to put him down.

But listen out for his words - they say a great deal. Although it's actually what he doesn't say that perhaps makes the biggest difference.

Colossians says it all - He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son.

Long live Christ the (bloodied, beaten, humiliated, glorious) King.
