Dear Friends

We've been watching Prisoner 951 documentary, the harrowing account of Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe's false imprisonment in Iran. In today's passage from Matthew 11, John the Baptist's suffers a similar fate, sitting in prison with nothing but stone walls, stale air, and zero chance of an early release. He must have wondered whether he had even identified the right Messiah. So, he dispatched a couple of disciples to ask Jesus: "Are You the One, or should we keep looking?" J

Jesus didn't respond with a drumroll or a celestial spotlight. Instead, simply saying: the blind seeing, the lame leaping, lepers freshened up, the deaf tuning in, the dead returning from cancelled funerals, and the poor receiving VIP access to good news.

As the messengers left, Jesus turned to the crowd and gave them a reality check. "What did you go into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the wind?"

Then Jesus dropped a compliment: "Among those born of women, no one is greater than John." Imagine receiving that heavenly accolade. Then Jesus added a kingdom twist: "even the least in heaven is greater still - God's rankings are built on grace, not human achievement.

For us, John offers a comforting lesson: even the strongest believers have moments of doubt. But Faith isn't the absence of questions—it's bringing those questions to Jesus. And Jesus' answer reminds us to look for His work, not just His words: healed hearts, restored lives, hope where despair once lived.

And, like the crowd, we're not to chase spiritual gimmicks—no reeds in the wind, no glittering distractions. Instead, we look for the real thing: the Christ who heals, restores, forgives, and keeps proving Himself through the lives He changes. In a world full of noise, His miracles still speak louder than our questions.
